Statement of Current Practice (Dec 2017)

I am currently a registered chiropractor with 34 years clinical experience. I graduated from Philip Institute of Technology (now RMIT University), B.App.Sc (chiro) in 1983. I have been continually involved in private practice for 34 years in Australia and the Republic of Ireland. I have post-graduate qualifications specific to the practice of chiropractic, including a doctoral degree (PhD) attained from University of Exeter, UK, after conducting a randomized controlled trial investigating the clinical practice of chiropractic. I have attained accredited post-graduate qualifications in chiropractic neurology (DACNB). I have lectured over 2000 hours for over 14 years on an accredited curriculum-based post-graduate course in chiropractic clinical neuroscience. I have managed and continue to manage many hundreds of chiropractic patients referred to me from 1999- present by other chiropractors. Many of these patients have suffered significant neurological deficit. My role has been to administer chiropractic treatment to these patients, as well as to advise other chiropractors on how best to manage chiropractic patients with significant neurological deficit. Over the past 18 years, I have delivered many hundreds of hours of chiropractic registration board approved lectures (CPD accredited) to the chiropractic profession in Australia regarding the chiropractic management of patients with neurological deficit. I have been a member of an accreditation panel assessing ongoing accreditation of a chiropractic college on behalf of the Chiropractors Registration Board of Victoria.
